What is a **BeeMat**? Before you leap to the conclusion that it is a mat which bees wipe their feet on before they enter the hive, let me tell you what it is. A BeeMat is a device used to turn unhealthy lakes into healthy lakes. How does it do that? Well, I will tell you.

In my community, we have several lakes. There is one lake which I used to check out over the years. This lake was a happy lake. It had healthy water. It had fish. It had ducks and turtles. It had snakes (I wasn't too crazy about the snakes) and it had alligators. It also had birds. Lots and lots of birds were flying in and out of the lake area. It was fun to watch. And then, one day, I started to notice that things appeared to be changing. It was a gradual change, but each time I checked out my lake, the changes became more noticeable.

After several years, I realized that the fish, ducks, turtles, alligators, snakes and birds were slowly disappearing. The disappearing snakes didn't bother me, but I knew that something was wrong and I didn't know what it was. The water looked good. It was very clear; however, there didn't seem to be any signs of life in it.

Since I liked my little lake and I was concerned about its welfare, I started to make inquiries regarding its disturbing condition. I learned that my lake had died. It was a dead lake. What had killed it?

Every time your yard guy fertilizes your yard, he loads it up with nutrients. These are chemicals which make your grass grow, which is a good thing, but, every time it rains or your irrigation system runs, some of these nutrients run into the lake and that is a bad thing. Why? Well, I will tell you.

Unless you have plants in the lake, around the bank of the lake or at the edge of the bank of the lake, the roots of which gobble up these nutrients, you have a big problem. In your yard, the nutrients are good guys. In the lake, they are bad guys. Why are they bad guys? Well, I am not going to tell you because it would take too long. You will just have to take my word for it. I am a lawyer and lawyers never lie, except when their lips move.

So, my little lake needed plants. I am happy to report that my homeowner association recognized the problem and took steps to correct the situation. There are now plants around the edge of the lake, in the water along the banks of the lake and, it has a **BeeMat.**

A BeeMat is a foam mat with holes in it. It floats on water. They stick plants in these holes which grow in water. They are called, "aquatic plants". (Am I impressing you?). The roots of these plants grow down into the water and gobble up nutrients. With these plants and the other plants chowing down on the evil nutrients, we will soon have a healthy lake. The fish, ducks, turtles, alligators, birds and, unfortunately snakes, will soon return. My little lake will be happy and so will I.
