JUST HOW LARGE IS PALMER RANCH?

The development area of Palmer Ranch is defined by the Master Development Order (MDO), filed with the state, region and county. This instrument allows up to 14,200 residential building values, as well as other values, such as Commercial-Industrial space, within the development area.

Look to the Master Association website at www.palmerranch.net for outline of the development area containing nearly 7,000 acres. Note from the website map the perimeter of the Development Area is not a rectangle.

Parcels of land within the MDO become part of the Master Association when an Incremental Development Order (IDO) is approved, thus size of the Master Association is not static. It will continue to grow until build out of land available within the Development Area.

There is an additional 2,400 acres (approximately) of Palmer Ranch, on the east side of I-75. At this time, this land is not anticipated to become part of the Master Association, and there is no Development Order for this land.

GUIDED TRAM TOUR

Saturday, January 6th from 1:30pm to 2:30pm take a tour around Oscar Scherer State Park and learn about the plants, animals, and park history. Tram seats 25 people. Maximum of 2 wheelchairs. Tickets sold from the Nature Center the day of, starting at 9:00am, cash only please. Tram picks up guests in front of Nature Center. \$5 per person, children under 5 ride free.

SARASOTA AUDUBON SOCIETY - BIRD WATCHING TOURS

The Sarasota Audubon Society is hosting bird watching field trips from **8:30am to 10:00am every Thursday through April 12**th. This walk begins at the Nature Center of Oscar Scherer State Park. Park opens 8:00am and park entrance fee applies. No reservations necessary. No pets please, comfortable walking shoes, sunscreen, insect repellent, drinking water, camera and binoculars recommended. Guided bird walk on sandy hiking trails through the various park habitats, guided by alternating leaders Joyce Leary and Peter Brown.

GUIDED SCRUB JAY WALK

This walk begins at the Nature Center **every Sunday from 8:30am to 10:00am** and includes an informative walk through an ancient dune system. This unique habitat is home to the threatened Florida scrub-jay and a variety of plants and other animals. Participants should wear comfortable footwear for walking in soft sand. Cameras and binoculars are suggested. Space is limited to 15 people. There is no cost to participate other than normal park entrance fees for day-use.

EAGLE VIEWING

Join the weekly eagle watch **every Sunday from 9:00am to 11:00am** and see how their pair of nesting Bald Eagles are doing. High-powered scope and trail maps are provided. Comfortable shoes, camera and binoculars are suggested. Located at the eagle viewing station along the Green Trail. Note: There is a 20-minute, self-guided walk to the eagle viewing station. Free with camping or standard park entrance fee.
