ANNUAL NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTERS DAY



Sue's Grounds Corner


Palmer Ranch 100-Year Floodplain Map

Question: "What are our abilities to control, in any way, the volume of water flow should a major storm loose torrents of water upon us?"

Answer: Way back in 1988 when Palmer Ranch was being subdivided and platted, the forefathers created a detailed, digital hydrodynamic flood model. Stephen Suau, at the time was running the Sarasota County Stormwater Department and was one of those forefathers. He was one of the design team for Palmer Ranch. Mr. Suau oversaw the development and continued application of detailed hydraulic system models that accurately predicted existing and on-going system (water) changes. Sarasota County, Florida State and Federal Government all later followed the lead of Palmer Ranch's progressive design.

The system is simple in that each community is charged with holding their own stormwater runoff in ponds and/or lakes. The ponds were designed to hold water long enough so that a certain amount can percolate and filter itself back through the layers of soil and ultimately recharge our aquifers. When the amount of water coming from the sky exceeds the amount percolating, then we rely on the stormwater outflow control structures that are in your ponds to regulate the water discharge. Most often these structures are also outfitted with aluminum skimmers which hold back the floating contaminants (greases, oil and litter). The outflow structures allow water to drain down into one of Palmer Ranch's 4 water basins that ultimately wind up in Little Sarasota Bay. The water basins that lead to Little Sarasota Bay are Catfish Creek and Elligraw Bayou that both run on the west side of Palmer Ranch, South Creek that runs along the east side of the Ranch and North Creek that runs along the southern border of Palmer Ranch. All these water basins then drain into the Gulf of Mexico.

In order to understand this better, I'm attaching the Palmer Ranch 100-year Floodplain map. It is very difficult to read, so I suggest you keep enlarging until you find your community on Palmer Ranch. The map distinctly shows how each of your ponds flows into the other and then eventually into neighboring communities and then finally downstream.
