
### **Everything You Need to Know About Palmer Ranch**

### **NEW DEVELOPMENTS**

The development area of Palmer Ranch is defined by the Master Development Order (MDO) with Sarasota County. This instrument allows up to 14,200 residential building units as well as other units such as Commercial-Industrial within the development area.

Parcels of land within the MDO become part of the Master Association when an Incremental Development Order (IDO) is approved, thus the size of the Master Association is not static. It will continue to grow until build out of land available within the development area.

To date, 29 Increments have been approved. All development within Palmer Ranch must abide by the strict design guidelines, which Palmer Ranch is known for. Additionally, regardless if the new development is residential, commercial or recreational, assessments will be paid to the Master Association, which provides additional funds for enhancements and maintenance of Palmer Ranch.

### **Sue's Grounds Corner**



This is why Palmer Ranch would like all of our communities to keep their BioFilter (Low Maintenance Zones) areas intact. This photo was taken during the recent Tropical Storm Eta event. This is a SWFWMD stormwater drain on Sawyer Loop Road, right along the Pool Water Products building. The idea behind these structures is to hold back the water long enough so that it will percolate down to our aquifers which is how they get refreshed. These stormwater basins are also engineered to collect rainwater from asphalted surfaces and send it through underground piping, culverts or ditches. These structures can be found on both public and private property. On Palmer Ranch, all the water draining into one of these structures is directed into one of the creeks on Palmer Ranch. The water after traveling through the windy path is then discharged UNTREATED into Little Sarasota Bay. All citizens should be aware that stormwater collected by catch basins does not flow to the treatment plant at Central County Utilities.

Any and all contaminants in this water also flows down the structure, hence the need for Low Maintenance Zones. Without these zones, fertilizers and lawn treatment chemicals flow downstream winds up in Little Sarasota Bay.
