OPPORTUNITY TO ASSIST IN PARK MAINTENANCE AND MONITORING NESTING BALD EAGLES

One of the attractions of living in Palmer Ranch is the opportunity to view wildlife, both native and migratory. Here's an opportunity to monitor nesting bald eagles and assist in light maintenance and habitat improvement of two Sarasota County parks in and around Palmer Ranch.

Culverhouse Nature Park off McIntosh Road is situated on 82 acres. It includes a community garden, picnic areas, hiking trails and parking. A pair of eagles have

nested in the park for several years. The eaglets appear in late December or January and usually fledge in March or April.

Scherer-Thaxton Preserve consists of 287 acres on both sides of Honoré Avenue just north of the junction with Highway 681. The area near the parking lot on the west side of Honoré includes a fitness trail and hiking/biking trails that in the dry season connect to the Legacy Trail and Oscar Scherer State Park. The park also includes an active eagle nest, which is easily visible from one of the trails.

The eagle nests in both parks are included in the Audubon Society's EagleWatch Program. The county's park manager of both parks has been the only monitor of the two nests. The county has posted notices for a volunteer to assist the park manager with invasive vegetation management and monitoring throughout areas of each of the parks.

A project through the Palmer Ranch Natural Assets Committee will enable interested residents of Palmer Ranch to fill jointly the position of volunteer first for Culverhouse Park and later for Scherer Thaxton Preserve. From there anyone interested would search the opportunity listed as Culverhouse or Scherer Thaxton Preserve, with the code PCUL for Culverhouse Nature Park or PSCH, the code Scherer-Thaxton Preserve.


Participants will take turns monitoring the eagle nest for at least 15-20 minutes once a week and write a report of the viewing to the park manager. The park manager will include the information in his reports to the Audubon Society's EagleWatch Program. Participants will also assist the park manager in maintaining the hiking trails. This involves working closely with parks staff to implement invasive plant control projects, removal of trash and debris as necessary and reporting of safety issues and damage to the appropriate county agencies. The park also needs assistance in removal of invasive vegetation and bushes.

Presenter: Dr. Frank A. Cassell, Chairman of the Sarasota County Centennial 2021 Steering Committee

Presenter Bio: Frank A. Cassell is Professor Emeritus and President Emeritus at the University of Pittsburgh at Greensburg. He earned the B.A. degree at Wabash College in Crawfordsville, Indiana, and his M.A. and Ph. D. degrees at Northwestern University. He taught and served as an administrator at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and Roosevelt University in Chicago before taking the presidency at Pitt-Greensburg. Cassell has published books and articles on the colonial and early national periods of American history, the Columbian Exposition of 1893, social history in Indiana in the 19th century, and his experiences as a university president. The Board of Trustees of the University of Pittsburgh named a new academic building at Pitt-Greensburg in his honor in 2012. He has also won awards for excellence in teaching, outstanding historical research, and community service. The Florida Book Awards awarded Suncoast Empire: Bertha Honoré Palmer, Her Family, and the Rise of Sarasota the 2017 silver award for nonfiction. He retired and moved to Sarasota with his spouse, Beth, in 2007 and served two terms as a member of the Sarasota County Historical Commission. He is on the board of the History and Preservation Coalition of Sarasota County where he heads the History and Preservation Awards Committee and chairs the Sarasota County Centennial 2021 Steering Committee. His latest book, Creating Sarasota County, was written to provide historical support for the Sarasota County Centennial 2021 celebration.
