SANDHILL CRANE COLTS SEASON - COMING SOON!

Two subspecies of Sandhill Crane occur in Florida. The Florida Sandhill Crane population numbers between four and five thousand, are non-migratory yearround breeding residents, and are state protected. They are joined every winter by 25,000 migratory Greater Sandhill Cranes that nest every spring in the Great Lakes region. The babies are called "colts" because of their long spindly legs. These majestic birds make their home in our freshwater preservation areas. **Please be mindful of these downy Native Floridians as you travel along the picturesque roads of Palmer Ranch!**

Everything You Need to Know About Palmer Ranch – Our History

The $7,000\pm$ acre development, known as Palmer Ranch, was created as a model of contemporary planning and environmental sensitivity. The property is part of a legacy of a remarkable turn-of-the-century woman: Mrs. Bertha Potter Palmer. In addition to her significant contributions to Sarasota, Mrs. Palmer's achievements were many.

After her husband's death in 1902, Mrs. Palmer's influence was felt in the littleknown town called Sarasota. She first visited the area in 1910, declaring that it was "the most beautiful place in Florida." Her impressions were published throughout the country, causing a local real estate boom. At a time when most



women of her age and social standing were content to play parlor games, she purchased 80,000 acres of land in Sarasota, and was involved in agriculture, livestock, real estate, banking and tourism. Mrs. Palmer had a profound love for the natural beauty of Florida. She would have been proud to know that, after her death in 1918, much of her land has been preserved as state parks, nature preserves and quality development.

Hugh Culverhouse, Sr. purchased the remaining 12,000 acres from the Palmer estate in 1972. He shared Mrs. Palmer's love of the land and created the Palmer Ranch community. Mr. Culverhouse's dream continues to evolve through his son, Hugh F. Culverhouse, Jr. Palmer Ranch has received state and national recognition as an exemplary community and a model of state-of-the-art planning.

Welcome Back Snowbirds and New Residents of Palmer Ranch

For some of you who have not been here in a couple of years due to COVID and for others moving into the area from other parts of the country, this is really a WARNING to be on ALERT. Building and development in the area have caused many of our Florida predators to start encroaching on our residential neighborhoods. We all love our fur babies very much and I cannot stress enough just how crucial and important it is for you to keep your pets/animals INSIDE. I do a lot of inspecting of the Ranch at nightime and I've seen these animals walking down the middle of the road. I saw a Bobcat sitting in the middle of McIntosh Road just south of Palmer Ranch Parkway about a year ago. I've seen Coyotes crossing the road in front of me on Central Sarasota Parkway. Walk your dogs on very short leashes, DO NOT allow them to run loose, always have them in your sight and close by and DO NOT allow your cat to be outside at all, they are prime targets. These predators run fast and If hungry enough they will find a way to get your pet; your fur baby! I'm not doing this to scare you but to alarm you, you need to stay vigilant especially when taking FIDO out for his bathroom break. It's never a good idea to leave your pets unattended at any time of day, this includes inside your pool cage where you think they might be safe, screening can be cut through very fast when you've got really sharp nails and teeth. Below are pictures I've pulled off the internet to show the difference of the 4 legged type predators in our area. For those with really small dogs pay attention to the sky also, hawks and eagles have been known to pick small animals right off the ground and take off. Bobcat on the left looks like an overgrown cat with a bobtail and the Coyote on the right almost looks like an overgrown fox with point large ears and a bushy long tail.

Sarasota County Planning and Development Services wants you to know that the property owner of the Palmer Ranch Development of Regional Impact (DRI) has applied for: 1) Application for Incremental Development Approval (AIDA) XXX; and 2) Rezone Petition No. 22-31 to rezone approximately 25.9 acres from OUE-1 (Open Use, Estate, 1 unit/5 acres) to RSF-3/PUD (Residential, Single-Family, 4.5 units/acre/Planned Unit Development) zone district to allow for development of a 99-unit townhome community.

The Planning Commission will hold Public Hearings beginning at 5:00 p.m., or as soon thereafter as possible, on January 19, 2023, at the County Administration Center, Commission Chamber, 1660 Ringling Blvd., Sarasota, Florida.





Through Veteran's Services at Southeastern Guide Dogs, U.S. Marine Captain Mike Deardorff and his service dog Ryan are now a team in his effort to overcome PTSD. Mike began his 10-year military career in the Marines, first as an F/A-18 electrician and then in artillery. He worked toward becoming an officer, was commissioned as a Lieutenant, and ended his military career in 2004 at the rank of Captain. In 2003, he deployed for Operation Iraqi Freedom. Then came 17 years of struggle with post-traumatic stress disorder. Now, he's found freedom in Ryan, "Ryan's impact on my life is immeasurable, he is my life saver. He is the one who can bring me into the moment without saying anything. He is the one who gives me hope." Come meet U.S. Marine Veteran Mike Deardorff and Ryan and hear Mike's life changing journey.
