Communication from the Master Association to our Members

Palmer Ranch Master Association Board

There are many property types on Palmer Ranch. For purposes of classification and representation to the Master Association they are: Residential, Commercial / Industrial, and Recreational.

What makes up the Board of Trustees of the Master Association? There are fifteen (15) Board Members; ten (10) are elected from Residential Members, three (3) from Commercial-Industrial and two (2) from Recreational Members. The Declarant has exercised its option by appointing a sixteenth member to the Board.

Sarasota County Neighborhood Initiative Grant Program

The Neighborhood Initiative Grant Program (NIGP) is a 50/50 matching grant program that funds projects to improve and enhance neighborhoods. It provides matching grants of up to \$10,000 to neighborhoods, homeowner's associations, and other resident-based groups located in Sarasota County. The projects must fall under one of the five categories: Character, Safety, Leadership, Environment, and Health.

CERT Member Training

Are you interested in improving your personal survival and recovery skills for hurricanes and other disasters, while working in a community-based team environment? If you are, then Community Emergency Response Team ("CERT") training is

the proven method to move you towards achieving that goal.

The mission of the CERT program is to educate volunteers about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact our area and train them in basic disaster response skills. This includes basic first aid skills. CERT members enhance community resilience by providing critical support to first responders and assisting victims during emergencies. CERT members also engage in community safety projects during non-emergency times.

Carol Auricchio, President of the Palmer Ranch Master Association, said, "I am delighted to see the progress made by our CERT team in a relatively short period of time. The work and dedication of these individuals is one of the reasons that make Palmer Ranch a special place to live. I encourage others to find out more and consider this very worthwhile endeavor".

Our Palmer Ranch community CERT members are service minded, committed volunteers who have undergone practical training to enhance the safety of their families and neighbors. They are people the community and Sarasota first responders look to in times of emergency!

You may ask "am I the right person for CERT?" No previous training is necessary, and no physical constraints disqualify you. If you are willing to "Give Back" to your community, there is a place for you!

Training for CERT is free, via an on-line course, with an in-person practical section done locally. The quality of practical information included makes the training extremely rewarding. The time commitment for the course is 20 hours, split between classroom and practical sessions. Once qualified you are welcome to join an existing Palmer Ranch community CERT or start one in your community.

Coexisting With Alligators

Palmer Ranch residents may sometimes see an alligator cruising in a pond or sunbathing on shore.


Alligators, which descended from the same common ancestor as dinosaurs, are technically reptiles but are in fact more closely related to birds, according to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission.



Alligators have existed for approximately 85 million years. They were here well before us. Early last century, humans hunted alligators nearly to extinction. They are now federally protected by the Endangered Species Act as a threatened species and as a Federally designated threatened species by Florida's Endangered and Threatened Species Rule. We now share our state with about 1.3 million alligators.

In Florida, serious injuries from alligators are rare. Nevertheless, living safely with our ancient alligator neighbors relies on taking common-sense precautions: Don't feed them. In fact, it is illegal to do so. Alligators are generally afraid of people but feeding them can cause them to lose that important fear (and put them in danger of being 'removed'; more about that below).

- Don't walk right at the edge of ponds when you can avoid it, and do not bring small children or dogs to ponds' edges. Keep pets on a leash. Watch for alligators relaxing nearby and give them plenty of space.
- Don't swim or wade in the ponds.
- Leave the alligators alone. Know that they are mostly active between dusk and dawn and during mating season typically April-June in Florida.



When a resident asks to have an alligator removed, they are typically asked if the alligator is aggressive. Generally, a non-aggressive alligator can be left in peace. If the resident still wants the alligator to be 'removed', it is in fact killed and then sold for its meat and hide – it is not simply relocated. Please consider Palmer Ranch's alligators as wildlife to be admired and respected.

If a problem arises, call your community manager or the person overseeing natural assets.


